This means that lawn care chemicals and grass clippings, litter, pet wastes, automotive products like used oil and antifreeze, plus other wastes are dumped untreated, into our waterways. Pollution and harmful bacteria go straight into our local fish habitat, swimming areas and drinking water.

There are things we can do to help! Individuals or groups can volunteer to place markers along our streets to remind everyone not to dump things down the storm drains.
